Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §347-A, sub-§6 is enacted to read:

6. Land use violations. The department may not initially 6 investigate any complaint or allegation of a violation of a land use law or rule, including laws or rules regulating the use of shorelands under section 438-A or protected natural resources under chapter 3, subchapter I, article 5-A, made to the department, but shall refer such a complaint or allegation to the local code enforcement officer or comparable local authority for 12 the locality in which the alleged violation occurred. The department may investigate such a complaint or allegation if the local code enforcement officer or comparable local authority 14 refers the complaint or allegation back to the department.

Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §480-R, sub-§2, as affected by PL 1989, c. 890, Pt. A, §40 and amended by Pt. B, §82, is further amended to read:

2. Enforcement. In addition to department staff, inland fisheries and wildlife game wardens, Department of Marine Resources marine patrol officers, local code enforcement officers and all other law enforcement officers enumerated in Title 12, section 7055, shall enforce the terms of this article.

STATEMENT OF FACT

30 This bill encourages the use of local enforcement mechanisms for land use violations by prohibiting the Department of Environmental Protection from investigating a complaint or 32 allegation of a violation of a land use law or rule, including 34 those pertaining to protected natural resources and shorelands, unless the complaint or allegation is first referred back to the 36 local code enforcement officer and the code enforcement officer then refers the matter back to the department. The bill also 38 specifically grants enforcement authority of the protected natural resources laws to local code enforcement officers.
