An Act to Expand the Membership of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §241, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B, §5, is further amended to read:

§241. Organization and duties

The Commission on Uniform State Laws, as established by Title 5, section 12004-K, subsection 8, shall-eensist consists of 10 3 members to be appointed for a term of 4 years by the Governor. The-commission-shall-also-consist-of, any residents who, because of long service in the cause of state legislation, are elected 12 life members of the National Conference of Commissioners on 14 Uniform State Laws, any residents who have served as president, secretary or chair of the Executive Committee of the National 16 Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws and the Revisor of Statutes, who serves as an associate commissioner, ex The commission shall examine subjects on which 18 officio. uniformity of legislation in the different states is desirable; ascertain the best means to effect uniformity; cooperate with the 2.0 commissioners of other states in the consideration and drafting of uniform acts for submission to the Legislatures of the several 22 states; and prepare bills for introduction in the Legislature.

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Each commissioner shall--be--eempensated, except for the associate commissioner, is entitled to compensation as provided in Title 5, chapter 379.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill allows a person who has been president, secretary or chair of the Executive Committee of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws to serve indefinitely as an additional Maine commissioner. This change allows former Chief Justice McKusick to serve as a Maine commissioner.

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The bill also designates the Revisor of Statutes as an associate commissioner, ex officio, which brings state law into conformity with the rules of the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.

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
