

NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE

An Act to Expand the Membership of the National Conference of
Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §241, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B,
4 §5, is further amended to read:

6 **§241. Organization and duties**

8 The Commission on Uniform State Laws, as established by
9 Title 5, section 12004-K, subsection 8, ~~shall consist~~ consists of
10 3 members to be appointed for a term of 4 years by the Governor.
11 ~~The commission shall also consist of,~~ any residents who, because
12 of long service in the cause of state legislation, are elected
13 life members of the National Conference of Commissioners on
14 Uniform State Laws, any residents who have served as president,
15 secretary or chair of the Executive Committee of the National
16 Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws and the Revisor
17 of Statutes, who serves as an associate commissioner, ex
18 officio. The commission shall examine subjects on which
19 uniformity of legislation in the different states is desirable;
20 ascertain the best means to effect uniformity; cooperate with the
21 commissioners of other states in the consideration and drafting
22 of uniform acts for submission to the Legislatures of the several
23 states; and prepare bills for introduction in the Legislature.

24 Each commissioner ~~shall be compensated,~~ except for the
25 associate commissioner, is entitled to compensation as provided
26 in Title 5, chapter 379.

30 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

32 This bill allows a person who has been president, secretary
33 or chair of the Executive Committee of the National Conference of
34 Commissioners on Uniform State Laws to serve indefinitely as an
35 additional Maine commissioner. This change allows former Chief
36 Justice McKusick to serve as a Maine commissioner.

38 The bill also designates the Revisor of Statutes as an
39 associate commissioner, ex officio, which brings state law into
40 conformity with the rules of the National Conference of
41 Commissioners on Uniform State Laws.
