An Act to Provide an Inactive License for Barbers and Cosmetologists.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec.1. 32 MRSA §14235-A is enacted to read:
4	<u>§14235-A. Inactive licenses</u>
б	<u>A licensee who does not desire to practice any of the</u>
8	activities described in section 14202 and wants to preserve the license while not engaged in any of those activities may
10	surrender the license for placement on inactive status. A license may be placed on inactive status only upon proper
12	application by the licensee and payment of the required fee. During inactive status, the licensee shall renew the inactive
14	<u>status every 3 years.</u>
16	<u>A licensee who has surrendered the license pursuant to this</u> section may have the license returned to active status by proper
18	application for an active license and payment of that fee, except
20	that a license placed on inactive status after the effective date of this section and remaining inactive for 3 or more years may be
22	reactivated only by successfully passing a license examination designated by the board.

30	N. For a late filing penalty fee for repeat offenders, \$100 . <u>; and</u>
32	Sec. 3. 32 MRSA 14238 , sub- $1, 0$ is enacted to read:
34	O. For a 3-year inactive status license, \$60.
36	STATEMENT OF FACT

40	This bill allows barbers and cosmetologists to place their licenses in an inactive status at a fee of no more than \$60 for 3 years. Licensees who wish to return to an active status within 3
42	years may do so without taking the examination required of new licensees. Licensees who choose to return to active status after
44	3 years must pass an examination as designated by the Board of Barbering and Cosmetology.
