40	A person may not fish for or take scallops from Cobscook Bay
22	and Passamaquoddy Bay with any drag or combination of drags more than 5 feet, 6 inches in width, measured from the extreme outside

26	STATEMENT OF FACT
28	This bill establishes December 1st through April 15th as the
30	fixed season for scallop harvesting in the coastal waters of Cobscook Bay and Passamaquoddy Bay. The bill also establishes a
32	5 1/2 foot limit on the size of scallop drags.
