Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §5016 is enacted to read:

§5016. Legislative consultation

The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters may meet annually in the 30 days following the issuance of the regulatory agenda of the Department of Conservation, including the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, under Title 5, section 8060 to review and discuss the regulatory agenda. The chairs of the committee shall determine an appropriate date, time and location for the meeting. The commissioner and the chair of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission shall attend the meeting. The committee chairs, the commissioner and the chair of the commission may agree in advance of the meeting on an agenda to include only those proposed rulemakings that, in their judgment, are of major consequence. Committee members may be reimbursed for direct expenses associated with their attendance at these meetings.

Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §342, sub-§15 is enacted to read:

15. Legislative consultation. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters may meet annually in the 30 days following the issuance of the regulatory agenda of the Board of Environmental Protection under Title 5, section 8060 to review and discuss the regulatory agenda. The chairs of the committee shall determine an appropriate date, time and location for the meeting. The commissioner and chair of the board shall attend the meeting. The committee chairs, the commissioner and the chair of the board may agree in advance of the meeting on an agenda to include only those proposed rulemakings that, in their judgment, are of major consequence. Committee members may be reimbursed for direct expenses associated with their attendance at these meetings.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill creates an annual forum for discussion among the Legislature, the Department of Conservation and the Department of Environmental Protection regarding the implementation of legislation via agency rulemaking. These discussions will allow exploration of questions of legislative intent prior to the initiation of formal rulemaking.
