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Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13019-F is enacted to read:

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### \$13019-F. Speech and language certificates

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Speech and language certificates must be issued and renewed in accordance with rules of the state board adopted pursuant to this chapter. Certification standards adopted by the state board in compliance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1990, 20 United States Code, Sections 1400-1485, must include a master's degree or its equivalent in speech pathology or any area that the state board determines is equivalent, if that standard meets the requirements of 34 Code of Federal Regulations, 300.153 (1992).

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Speech and language clinicians who hold valid certificates issued prior to September 30, 1993, have until July 1, 2015 to satisfy the requirements of certification standards adopted by the state board to comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1990.

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The department shall offer, annually, at least 4 and not more than 6 courses designed to help speech and language clinicians, who hold certificates issued prior to September 30, 1993, satisfy the requirements of certification standards adopted by the state board to comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act of 1990.

30 The department shall review and accept, at no charge, all course work successfully completed by speech and language clinicians certified prior to September 30, 1993, if the course 32 work satisfies certification requirements.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the State Board of Education to adopt 38 certification requirements for speech and language clinicians that include a master's degree or its equivalent in speech 40 pathology or a master's degree or its equivalent in a related 42 area if those requirements meet standards established by federal The bill requires the state board to establish rules that speech and language clinicians with valid certificates 44 issued prior to September 30, 1993, until July 1, 2015 to meet new certification requirements.

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48 This bill also requires the Commissioner of Education to offer, annually, 4 to 6 courses designed to help speech and language clinicians with valid certificates issued prior to 50

September 30, 1993 meet new certification requirements and requires the department to review and accept, at no cost, all course work that meets certification requirements submitted by those certificate holders.
