## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §326, sub-\$1, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, c. 590, is amended to read:

- 1. Payment of proceeds. An organization licensed 6 operate beano, bingo or lucky seven games may use the proceeds or 8 part of the proceeds to pay salaries, wages or remuneration to any person directly and essentially involved in operating the 10 beano, bingo or lucky seven game and to defray the expenses or part of the expenses of activities that further the purpose for 12 which the organization is formed. Expenses may be defrayed for activities that include but are not limited to the organization's 14 group bus trips and enrollment in academic courses. Proceeds may not be used to purchase alcohol or to defray the cost of 16 activities where alcohol is served. Proceeds may not be paid directly to organization members. The licensing division may 18 limit the total amount of proceeds that an organization may spend. An organization that chooses to make such payments or use 20 proceeds to defray the expenses of activities must file with the Chief of the State Police, at least quarterly, a disposition of 22 funds form prescribed by the Chief of the State Police detailing payments made and expenses incurred pursuant to this section. Every statement on the form must be made under oath by 24 an officer of the organization but notarization is not required.
  - Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §335, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 825, §3, is amended to read:
  - 30 Exception. Notwithstanding subsection 1, a licensee may pay the proceeds or part of the proceeds of games of chance to a member, auxiliary member, officer or employee of the licensed 32 organization as remuneration for a serious illness or injury or casualty loss, or may use the proceeds to defray the expenses or 34 part of the expenses of activities that further the purpose for 36 which the organization is formed, if the licensee makes application pursuant to this section and the application approved by the State Police, Licensing Division. 38 Expenses may be defrayed for activities that include but are not limited to 40 the organization's group bus trips and enrollment in academic courses. Proceeds may not be used to purchase alcohol or to 42 defray the costs of activities where alcohol is served. Proceeds may not be paid directly to organization members. The licensing 44 division may limit the total amount of proceeds that an organization may spend.
