An Act Regarding the Removal of Public Utility Commission Commissioners.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §105-A is enacted to read:

<u>§105-A. Removal</u>

A commissioner may be removed from office by an affirmative 8 vote of 2/3 of the elected members of the House of Representatives. The instrument removing a commissioner from 10 office may be introduced in the House of Representatives in the same manner as a bill and may be considered by the House of 12 Representatives in the same manner as a bill, provided that the House of Representatives may approve the measure only in the manner specified in this section. The instrument removing a 14 commissioner is titled "A Removal of a Commissioner of the Public 16 Utilities Commission For Reasons Specified by Vote of the Members of the House of Representatives" and must specify the name of the 18 commissioner to be removed and the basis for the removal. Unless otherwise specified in the instrument, the commissioner named in 20 the instrument is removed from office immediately upon approval of the instrument as provided in this section.

STATEMENT OF FACT

26 This bill provides that a commissioner of the Public Utilities Commission may be removed by an affirmative vote of 2/3 28 of the elected members of the House of Representatives.

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
