

**An Act to Allow Rental Vehicles to be Used on a Temporary Basis by
Limousine Companies.**

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §110-B is enacted to read:

6 §110-B. Use of vehicles by limousine companies

8 1. Vehicle not required to display limousine plates.
10 Notwithstanding section 110, a limousine company may hire out
12 with a driver a vehicle that is not registered as a limousine and
14 does not display plates issued to limousines if the conditions
established in subsection 2 are met. "Limousine company" means a
company that has one or more registered limousines displaying
plates issued for that class of registration in accordance with
section 192.

16 2. Conditions. Subsection 1 applies only when the
18 following conditions are met:

20 A. The vehicle is rented by the limousine company for a
period not to exceed one month; and

22 B. The limousine company has on file with the Secretary of
24 State an insurance policy or bond that covers the vehicle at
26 the level required for its use by the limousine company in
accordance with section 2708-A.

28 STATEMENT OF FACT

30 This bill allows limousine companies to rent vehicles on a
32 temporary basis and hire those vehicles out provided that the
limousine company has insurance for those vehicles appropriate to
their use.
