	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec.1. 17-A MRSA §807 is enacted to read:
4	<u>§807. Animal enterprise terrorism</u>
6 8	1. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
10	A. "Animal enterprise" means:
12	(1) A commercial or academic enterprise that uses animals for food or fiber production, agriculture,
14	research or testing;
16	<u>(2) A zoo, aquarium, circus, rodeo or lawful</u> competitive animal event; or
18	(3) Any fair or similar event intended to advance
20	agricultural arts and sciences.
22	<u>B. "Economic damage" means the replacement costs of loss or damaged property or records, the costs of repeating an</u>
24	<u>interrupted or invalidated experiment or the loss of profits</u> or loss of food production or farm income reasonably
26	attributable to an act of animal enterprise terrorism.
28	C. "Physical disruption" does not include any lawful disruption that results from lawful public, governmental or
30	<u>animal enterprise employee reaction to the disclosure of information about an animal enterprise.</u>
32	2. A person is guilty of animal enterprise terrorism if
34	<u>that person intentionally causes physical disruption to the functioning of an animal enterprise by intentionally stealing,</u>
36	<u>damaging or causing the loss of any property, including animals</u> or records used by the animal enterprise, and thereby causes
38	economic damage to that enterprise.
40	3. Animal enterprise terrorism is a Class E crime.
42 44	4. A person convicted of violating subsection 2 is subject to an order for restitution up to 3 times the economic damage.
46	STATEMENT OF FACT
48	The purpose of this bill is to protect animal enterprise in the State. This bill makes it an offense to cause intentional

damage or violence to research, agricultural or exhibition facilities housing animals and to animals and records in those facilities. The restitution may be 3 times the economic damage and will be given to the victim of the crime.
