SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 176, L.D. 228, "RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Protect State Parks"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the title and before the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

Amend the resolution by striking out that part designated "Sec. 23." (page 1, lines 7 to 9 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 23. State park land. State park land, or other real estate designated by legislation implementing this section, may not be reduced or its uses substantially altered, except on the vote of two thirds of the members of each House present and voting.'

Further amend the resolution by striking the referendum question (page 1, lines 24 and 25 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

' "Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to protect state park or other designated land by requiring a 2/3 vote of the Legislature to reduce it or change its purpose?" ' ' '
