Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA \$4552, as amended by PL 1991, c. 99, \$1, is further amended to read:

6 §4552. Policy

To protect the public health, safety and welfare, it is 8 declared to be the policy of this State to keep continually in review all practices infringing on the basic human right to a 10 life with dignity, and the causes of these practices, so that corrective measures may, where possible, be promptly recommended 12 and implemented, and to prevent discrimination in employment, housing or access to public accommodations on account of race, 14 color, sex, sexual orientation, physical or mental disability, 16 religion, ancestry or national origin; and in employment, discrimination on account of age and in housing because of 18 familial status; and to prevent discrimination in the extension of credit on account of age, race, color, sex, sexual 20 orientation, marital status, religion, ancestry or national origin; and to prevent discrimination in education on account of sex or physical or mental disability. 22

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Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §4553, sub-§9-A is enacted to read:

<u>9-A. Sexual orientation. "Sexual orientation" means having</u> a preference for heterosexuality, homosexuality or bisexuality; having a history of that preference; or being identified with that preference.

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §4553, sub-§10, $\P E$, as amended by PL 1983, c. 578, §2, is further amended to read:

E. In determining whether any person is acting as an agent or employee of another person so as to make such <u>the</u> other person responsible for his <u>that person's</u> acts, the question of whether the specific acts performed were actually authorized or subsequently ratified shall <u>is</u> not be controlling; and

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orientation, except that a religious corporation, association or organization is exempt from these provisions.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to extend to all citizens regardless of their sexual orientation the same civil rights protections now guaranteed to citizens on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age, national origin and physical or mental handicap. Discrimination in the areas of employment, housing, public accommodations and credit would be prohibited.

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
