The estimated reduction of dedicated revenue is \$6,536 in fiscal year 1994-95. 12 The February 1, 1996 reinstatement of the ban on the sale of aseptic and composite material beverage containers will reduce 14 the loss of dedicated revenues from unclaimed deposits in fiscal 16 year 1995-96. The amount can not be determined at this time. 18 As its proportional share of dedicated revenues from the the Maine Waste Management Agency will experience a 20 reduction of \$4,706 in dedicated revenue in fiscal year 1994-95 and the Department of Environmental Protection will experience and are the control of the contro reduction of \$1,830. 22 The Maine Waste Management Agency will incur some minor 24 additional costs to revise the State's solid waste management plan and to submit a required legislative report.
