Sec. 1. 34-A MRSA §3002, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. 4 B, §159, is further amended to read:

## \$3002. Boards of visitors

1. Appointment. The-Governor-shall-appoint-a-beard-of-5
visiters-for-each-correctional-facility-under-the-department, as
authorized-by-Title-5, section-12004 I, subsection-5. There is
established pursuant to Title 5, section 12004, subsection 10 a
board of visitors for each correctional facility under the
department. The board consists of 7 members, 4 appointed by the
Governor and 3 jointly by the President of the Senate and the
Speaker of the House of Representatives. Each appointing officer
shall make appointments that provide representation to all areas
of the State.

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- A. The terms of the members of the boards of visitors are for one <u>calendar</u> year. Appointing authorities shall complete their appointments by January 1st of the year for which the members are appointed.
- B. Members of the boards of visitors are eligible for reappointment at the expiration of their terms, except that a member may not be reappointed who has failed to attend 1/2 or more of the board's meetings in the previous year.

  Members may not continue to serve after their term has expired unless reappointed.

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- C. No  $\underline{A}$  member of the Legislature may <u>not</u> serve on any board of visitors.
- D. Each member of the boards of visitors shall—be eempensated is entitled to compensation according to the previsiens—of Title 5, chapter 379.
- 38 <u>E. The Governor shall appoint an interim chair for the board. The board shall elect a permanent chair at the conclusion of the first meeting.</u>
- F. The interim chair of the board shall call the first meeting of the board for no later than January 30th of each year. If the chair fails to call the meeting, the commissioner shall call the meeting no later than February 15th. A quorum consists of a majority of members appointed at that time.

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2. Powers. Each board of visitors may shall inspect the correctional facility to which it is assigned and may make a report and recommendations on the management of the facility to the commissioner by November 1st of each year.

2	3. Duties. Boards of visitors have the following duties.
4	A. Boards of visitors shall send copies of all reports and recommendations to the members of the joint standing select
6	committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health andinstitutionalservices corrections matters, the
8	Executive Director of the Legislative Council and the Law and Legislative Reference Library.
10	B. Each board of visitors shall appear before the joint

16	4. Commissioner response. Within 30 days of receipt of the
18	board's recommendations, the commissioner shall respond in writing to the board concerning its recommendations and send a
20	copy of this response to the joint select committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over corrections matters and the
22	Executive Director of the Legislative Council.
24	5. Staffing. The board shall request required staffing
26	from the commissioner. The board shall comment on the adequacy of this staffing in its annual report.
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30	STATEMENT OF FACT
50	Currently, the boards of visitors of the various
32	correctional institutions consist of 5 persons appointed by the Governor. This bill reduces the number of gubernatorial
34	appointees to 4 and adds 3 persons to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
36	Representatives.
38	The bill provides for the appointment of chairs for the boards and makes them responsible for calling the first meeting
40	of the board each year.
42	The bill requires that the board visit the facility for which it is responsible each year, submit a report on the
44	management of that facility to the Commissioner of Corrections and the Legislature and appear before the responsible legislative
46	committee to respond to questions. It requires the Commissioner of Corrections to respond in writing to the report.
