- Sec. 3. 39-A MRSA §151, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 885, Pt. A, §8 and affected by §§9-11, is amended to read:
  - 1. Board established. Pursuant to Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 35, the Workers' Compensation Board is established as an independent board composed of 8 members. The members of the board must be appointed by the Governor within 30 days after a new-beard-member-is-authorized Governor takes office or a vacancy occurs, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters and confirmation by the Legislature. Notwithstanding the

provisions of Title 3, section 151, the designated committee shall complete its review of the appointments of the Governor within 15 days of the Governor's written notice of appointment and the vote of the Legislature must be taken no later than 7 days after the vote of the designated committee.

Four members of the board must be representatives of management and 4 members must be representatives of labor. All management representatives must be appointed from a list provided by the Maine Chamber of Commerce and Industry or other bona fide organization association of employers. A11 or representatives must be from a list provided by the Executive Board of the Maine AFL-CIO or other bona fide labor organization or association of employees representing at least 10% of the Maine work force. Any list submitted to the Governor must have at least 4 times the number of names as there are vacancies for the group represented by the vacancies.

A member of the board is not liable in a civil action for any act performed in good faith in the execution of duties as a board member.

A member of the board may not be a lobbyist required to be registered with the Secretary of State, a service provider to the workers' compensation system or a representative of a service provider to the workers' compensation system.

Members of the board hold office for staggered terms of 4 years, except for the initial members of the board whose terms expire on March 1, 1995. The-terms-of-one-member-representing-management and-one-member-representing-labor-expire-February-1st-of-each Member's terms are coterminous with the term of the Governor. A member may not serve for more than 2 full terms.

Sec. 4. Transition. The terms of persons currently serving on the Maine Health Care Finance Commission, the Public Utilities Commission and the Workers' Compensation Board are not affected by this Act until a new Governor takes office following a statewide general election for Governor in this State. time, the terms of persons currently serving on those commissions expire.

This bill proposes to make the terms of persons serving on the Health Care Finance Commission, the Public Utilities Commission and the Workers' Compensation Board coterminous with 8 the Governor's term. Persons currently serving in those positions may continue to serve until the next Governor takes office after the next election for Governor.
