34	Section 24. Expenditure limit and reserve fund. In any

38	Legislature. When actual General Fund revenues in a budget period exceed the accepted General Fund revenue estimates, 75% of

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Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this constitutional amendment out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an additional \$7,000.

If approved by the voters, the constitutional provision directing 75% of each year-end General Fund revenue surplus to a reserve fund will reduce the General Fund unappropriated surplus in future years. This provision will also override current statutory provisions allowing part of each year-end General fund revenue surplus to be transferred to the Maine Rainy Day Fund.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides that transfers to a reserve fund will be based on 75% of the difference between actual General Fund revenues exceeding budgeted revenues, with the remaining 25% being transferred to the Property Tax Relief Fund. It also caps that reserve fund at 10% of the previous fiscal year's total General Fund revenues, corrects certain date references and adds a fiscal note to the bill.
