	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6	Whereas, the reporting deadline of the Task Force on Mental Health Education and Licensure is February 1, 1993; and
8 + 5 10	Whereas, the task force requires additional time to complete its work and the deadline must be extended; and
12	Whereas, this extension must occur before the expiration of the 90-day period; and
14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
16	Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and

20	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

26	The task force shall convene no later than August 1, 1992 and issue its final report, with statutory recommendations, no later

30	jurisdiction over human resources matters and the advisory boards and commissions with jurisdiction over substance abuse and mental
