facilities and transitional services. The Department of Mental
Health and Mental Retardation may experience an increase in Other
Special Revenue due to the sale or lease of property. There may
also be a potential future savings to the General Fund since this
bill permits funds to be expended on new or expanded programs
that have historically been funded by additional General Fund
appropriations.

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The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau of General Services will incur some minor additional costs to approve the sale or lease of unused buildings and properties at state mental health and mental retardation facilities. These costs can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.'

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment replaces the original bill. It clarifies that the bill affects people with mental illness and people with mental retardation in the same way and clarifies what the proceeds from the sale of property may be used for. It also changes the effective date of the new provisions to January 1, 1994, since the bill is not an emergency measure.

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The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
