Presented by Representative MURPHY of Berwick. Cosponsored by Representatives: DiPIETRO of South Portland, MARSHALL of Eliot, Senator: CARPENTER of York. Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §1, sub-§§3-L and 3-M are enacted to read: <u>3-L. Handicapped person.</u> "Handicapped person" means a person who is permanently confined to a wheelchair or restricted to the permanent use of crutches or braces or otherwise handicapped in such a way that the person's mobility is seriously restricted. <u>3-M. Handicapped veteran.</u> "Handicapped veteran" means a veteran who is permanently confined to a wheelchair or restricted to the permanent use of crutches or braces or otherwise

<u>handicapped in such a way that the veteran's mobility is</u> <u>seriously restricted.</u>

Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §1, sub-§20-A is enacted to read:

20-A. Veteran. "Veteran" means a person who served in the
United States Armed Forces during any federally recognized period of conflict or was eligible for an Armed Forces Expeditionary
Medal or campaign medal and was not dishonorably discharged. A veteran of the Vietnam War must have served on active duty for a
period of more than 90 days. Part of that active duty service must have occurred after December 22, 1961 and before May 7, 1975, unless that veteran was discharged for a service-connected disability.

Sec. 3. 29 MRSA §192-A is enacted to read:

<u> 192-A. Veteran initial plates</u>

The Secretary of State may design and issue special veteran initial plates in accordance with the provisions of section 192. An application for a plate under this section must include a military certification verifying the applicant's military service. The plate design must include the word "Veteran" in red letters centered at the bottom of the initial plate.

Sec. 4. 29 MRSA §252, as amended by PL 1989, c. 481, Pt. A, $\S9$, is further amended to read:

§252. Handicapped persons

On application to the Secretary of State, any handicapped person or <u>handicapped veteran, or</u> the spouse, parents or legal guardian of a handicapped person <u>or handicapped veteran</u> who has registered a motor vehicle as the motor vehicle of principal use by the handicapped person shall <u>or handicapped veteran may</u> be issued a set of special designating plates to be used in place of

the regular registration plates. The handicap veteran plates must include the word "Veteran" in red letters centered at the 2 bottom of the special designating plate. A permanent placard may be issued under this section and-shall must be so affixed that 4 the information on the placard shall-be is clearly legible from · 6 the outside of the the motor vehicle. The placard shall must contain the name of the handicapped person or handicapped The Secretary of State shall establish by regulation a 8 veteran. system of color coding for placards issued pursuant to this section for the purpose of facilitating the determination of 10 validity of placards. When the Secretary of State deems 12 <u>determines</u> it appropriate, a placard may be issued to any handicapped person or handicapped veteran who does not have a duly registered motor vehicle. In such those cases, the placard 14 may be displayed on any motor vehicle properly registered in this 16 State, but it may only be so displayed during the time when the handicapped person or handicapped veteran is a passenger in the 18 vehicle, when the driver of the vehicle is transporting the handicapped person or handicapped veteran or when the driver is waiting for a service to be rendered to the handicapped person or 20 handicapped veteran. The annual registration fee is as set forth in this subchapter for the type of vehicle assigned the special 22 designating plates or placard. A \$1 fee shall-be is charged for 24 each placard issued.

On application to the Secretary of State, any handicapped person <u>or handicapped veteran</u> who has registered a motorcycle shall <u>may</u> be issued a special designating plate to be used in place of the regular registration plate.

A-handicapped-person-is-herein-defined-to-mean-a-person-who is--permanently-confined-to-a-wheelchair-or-restricted-to-the permanent-use-of-erutches-or-braces-or-otherwise-handicapped-in such-a-way-that-his-mobility-is-seriously-restricted.

An application under this section shall <u>must</u> be accompanied by the certificate of a physician as-te <u>certifying</u> that person's <u>or handicapped veteran's</u> physical disability. <u>In the case of a</u> <u>handicapped veteran, an application also must include a military</u> <u>certification verifying the applicant's military service.</u> Those persons <u>or handicapped veterans</u> who are found by their physicians to have permanent handicaps shall <u>are</u> not be required to submit annual certificates following their initial qualification.

Any person other than a handicapped person <u>or handicapped</u> <u>veteran</u> or the spouse of a handicapped person <u>or handicapped</u> <u>veteran</u> issued a set of special designating plates or placard under this section shall-be <u>is</u> subject to a \$100 fine for use of the special designating plates or placard. The <u>Use of the</u> special designating plates or placard shall-be <u>is</u> suspended if improper use is permitted.

These special designating plates shall must bear the International Handicap Symbol.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill permits the Secretary of State to issue special 12 veteran vanity license plates and special veteran handicap license plates.
