The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is responsible for printing and posting verbatim copies of the advisory and for incorporating the verbatim health advisory in the abstract of fish and wildlife laws.

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FISCAL NOTE

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The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to assess and prepare an advisory on any health risks posed to persons who eat sport fish caught by noncommercial anglers in state waters. These costs can be absorbed within the Bureau of Health's existing budgeted resources.

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The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur some minor additional costs to print and distribute the required health advisories. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the original bill. The amendment differs from the original bill in the following ways.

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- 1. It removes the requirement that the Bureau of Health submit an annual report to the Legislature.
- 32 2. It clarifies that the health assessment conducted by the Bureau of Health pertains to fish caught in state waters by noncommercial anglers.
- 36 3. It clarifies that the Director of the Bureau of Health has final say on wording of health advisories regarding consumption of fish caught by noncommercial anglers.
- 40 4. It removes a provision of the bill that prohibits the Bureau of Health from sharing any drafts of its advisories prior to final release, clarifying that scientific peer review of the draft advisories is allowed.

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5. It adds a fiscal note to the bill.
