An Act to Protect the Health of Anglers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1696-I is enacted to read: 4 <u>\$1696-I.</u> Sport fishing and public health annual report 6 On or before January 15th each year, the Director of the Bureau of Health shall report directly to the joint standing 8 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural 10 resources matters regarding any health threats to persons consuming freshwater and anadromous fish caught in state waters. 12 Content of report. On the basis of available 1. 14 information, the Director of the Bureau of Health shall assess all forms of threat to public health posed by the consumption of 16 fish caught in state waters by persons licensed under Title 12, section 7151, including, but not limited to, carcinogenic, 18 mutagenic, teratogenic and reproductive effects and infectious disease. In preparing the report, the director shall consult 20 with the Commissioner of Marine Resources, the Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries 22 and Wildlife. 24 2. Advisories. In the professional judgment of the Director of the Bureau of Health, if conditions exist in which 26 consumption of fish caught in state waters poses a threat to public health, the director shall prepare an advisory of the 28 public health threat. The advisory must be in a form suitable for posting in places frequented by sport anglers, included in the abstract of fish and wildlife laws prepared under Title 12, 30

section 7034, subsection 5 and distributed to all holders of
32 sport fishing licenses. The advisory must be included in the
report under subsection 1. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries
34 and Wildlife is responsible for printing and posting verbatim
copies of the advisory and for incorporating the verbatim health
36 advisory in the abstract of fish and wildlife laws.

 38 3. Early release prohibited. Prior to release of the final report to the committee, the Director of the Bureau of Health may
40 not release any draft, memo, summary or other information, that embodies the content of the report or the advisory under this
42 section to any person not employed within the Bureau of Health.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires the Director of the Bureau of Health to prepare an annual assessment of any health risks posed to persons 48 who eat sport fish caught in state waters. The director is required to prepare any necessary health advisories concerning 50 sport fish and submit consumption of a report to the 52 Legislature. The Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife

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is responsible for printing verbatim and distributing the health advisory in a form for posting. A verbatim copy of the advisory must be included in the abstract prepared by the commissioner for all sport fishing license holders.

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
