This bill establishes the Advisory Council on Energy and the
Environment. The council consists of 13 members including heads
of 3 relevant agencies, 3 Senators, 3 members of the House of
Representatives and 4 public members. The council is established
for the purposes of evaluating and making recommendations
concerning the State's environmental and energy policies.
Members of the council receive no compensation. The council
receives assistance from the Department of Environmental
Protection, the State Planning Office and the Public Utilities
Commission.
