An Act to Exempt Employees of the Public Utilities Commission from Furlough and Shutdown Days.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Public Utilities Commission is funded 6 exclusively by dedicated revenues and receives no funds from the General Fund; and

Whereas, the overall effectiveness of the Public Utilities 10 Commission has been significantly hampered by the current requirement that employees of the commission must take furlough 12 and shutdown days; and

14 Whereas, the intent of having furlough and shutdown days was largely to reduce costs of agencies funded by the General Fund
16 and the Highway Fund; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore,

24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Furlough days for employees of the Public Utilities
Commission. Subject to the approval of the parties signatory to
any applicable collective bargaining agreement, positions allocated to the Public Utilities Commission may not be subject
to discretionary furlough days and shutdown days.

32 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill exempts, subject to agreement through the collective bargaining process, employees of the Public Utilities
Commission from being required to take furlough and shutdown days.
