Provides for the allocation of the Stripper Well Fund to the Fuel Conversion Fund established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 4981 for the purposes of making loans and grants to low-income persons to aid in converting electric space heating systems to systems using other sources of fuel.'

16 Further amend the bill to renumber the sections to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of 20 fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

24 The Public Utilities Commission will experience some minor administrative savings from the repeal of its responsibility to 26 order electric utilities to develop cost-effective fuel conversion programs.

The Maine State Housing Authority will incur some minor additional costs to administer the Fuel Conversion Fund. The \$1,000,000 allocation of the Stripper Well Fund in fiscal year 1993-94 for loans and grants to low-income people and related administrative costs is subject to Department of Energy approval. If approval is not granted for these purposes, the Maine State Housing Authority will require additional General Fund appropriations. The exact amount can not be determined at this time.

The Governor's proposed supplemental budget includes changes 40 which may affect the availability of the Stripper Well Fund. This estimate of the fiscal impact may need to be adjusted based 42 on final legislative actions on the supplemental budget.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment is the minority report of the Joint Standing 48 Committee on Utilities.

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The original bill repeals that section of Maine law which 2 requires the Public Utilities Commission to order electric utilities to develop cost-effective fuel conversion programs for electric space heating systems. .4

б This amendment preserves that language of the bill and establishes the Fuel Conservation Fund to be administered by the 8 Maine State Housing Authority for the purposes of making grants and loans to low-income persons to undertake conversions of electric space heating systems to systems using other fuel 10 sources. The amendment makes allocations from the Stripper Well 12 Fund to the Fuel Conservation Fund.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
