Resolve, to Privatize Road Maintenance.

Reference to the Committee on Transportation suggested and ordered printed.

Presented by Representative JOY of Island Falls. Cosponsored by Representatives: JONES of Pittsfield, YOUNG of Limestone. Sec. 1. Commissioner of Transportation to develop an implementation plan for the privatization of road maintenance on state highways. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Transportation develop an implementation plan for the privatization of road maintenance on state highways. The implementation plan must include the following:

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1. A provision in which current state employees receive priority in the awarding of maintenance contracts;

2. Educational programs for all current state employees on the competitive bid process, self-employment options and requirements, types of business organizations, the procurement of benefits and other appropriate issues relating to establishing a business;

 A provision for the extension of membership in the Maine
State Retirement System for all Department of Transportation employees who are vested at the time a private maintenance
contract becomes effective;

22 4. A provision for the sale of state-owned maintenance equipment and facilities; and

5. A provision that outlines contract requirements, 26 including a provision for the monitoring and evaluation of all maintenance contracts; and be it further

Sec. 2. Reporting date established. Resolved: That the 30 commissioner shall report on the privatization implementation plan, including legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on 32 Transportation by December 1, 1993.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve directs the Commissioner of Transportation to develop an implementation plan for the privatization of road 38 maintenance on state highways. The plan must include opportunities for current employees to bid on the contracts, 40 educational programs and an extension of membership in the Maine State Retirement System for certain employees. The implementation 42 plan and legislation must be submitted by December 1, 1993.

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
