

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §1910-A is enacted to read:

6 §1910-A. Directional signs for points of historic interest

8 Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, the
10 commissioner, with the advice of the Travel Information Advisory
12 Council, shall designate a color and symbol that may be used on
14 official business directional signs that indicate points of
16 historic interest. The color and symbol must be different from
18 the colors and symbols used on all other official business
20 directional signs. Reflectorized lettering and a reflectorized
symbol may be used on business directional signs that indicate
points of historic interest.

18 STATEMENT OF FACT

20 This bill establishes a special official business
directional sign for points of historic interest.
