	STATEMENT OF FACT

	Current law requires that municipalities permit manufactured
14	homes up to 14 feet in width in "a number of locations," but not
	necessarily in all locations where other types of single-family
16	dwellings are allowed. Some municipalities continue to restrict

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

dwellings when placed on a building site.

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This bill requires municipalities to permit manufactured homes wider than 14 feet in all locations where single-family dwellings are permitted, if those manufactured homes comply with the municipal building codes.

the placement of manufactured homes wider than 14 feet, even though they may be indistinguishable from other single-family
