	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §252, 3rd ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL
4	1967, c. 218, §1, is amended to read:
6	A- <u>For purposes of this section, a</u> handicapped person is herein defined to mean a person who is permanently confined to a
8	wheelchair $\Theta \mathbf{f}_{\perp}$ restricted to the permanent use of crutches or braces $\Theta \mathbf{f}_{\perp}$ otherwise handicapped in such a way that $h \pm s$ that
10	person's mobility is seriously restricted or over the age of 75 years.
12	Sec. 2. 29 MRSA §252, 4th ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL
14	1975, c. 16, §2, is amended to read:
16	An <u>Except for a person over 75 years of age, an</u> application under this section shall <u>must</u> be accompanied by the certificate
18	of a physician as to that person's physical disability. Those persons who are <u>over 75 years of age or</u> found by their physicians
20	to have permanent handicaps shall are not be required to submit annual certificates following their initial qualification.

26	This bill allows any person over 75 years of age to obtain a handicapped parking permit.
