RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Protect Revenue in Other Special Revenue Funds.

Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

Constitution, Art. IX, §23 is enacted to read:

Section 23. Limitation on expenditure and use of funds in Other Special Revenue accounts. All revenues derived from fees, excises, license taxes, other special taxes related to Other Special Revenue funds and all other assets, proceeds or income related to Other Special Revenue funds or any successor funds established for a similar purpose and funded with revenue from sources other than the General Fund or Highway Fund must be expended for the exclusive purpose of meeting the statutory obligations of these funds and may not be encumbered for, or diverted to, other purposes. Revenue received from the Federal Government may be allocated as provided by federal or state law and the Legislature may establish special funds and deposit revenues collected, received or recovered into these special funds or Other Special Revenue funds, if applicable, provided that the revenues are allocated and expended only for the purposes of those special funds or the Other Special Revenue funds as provided by law.

; and be it further

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to provide that revenues derived from fees and special taxes and other revenues collected by the State of Maine and allocated to Other Special Revenue funds and all other assets, proceeds or income related to these funds must be allocated to and expended for the exclusive purpose of meeting the statutory obligations of these Other Special Revenue funds?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as

votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

The amendment provides that money collected, received or recovered and the assets, proceeds or income related to Other Special Revenue funds must be expended solely for the exclusive purpose of meeting the statutory obligations of these funds.
