is	further	amended to	read:							

"Litter" means all waste materials including, Litter. but not limited to, any bottles, glass, crockery, cans, scrap metal, junk, paper, garbage, rubbish, offal, feathers, except feathers from live birds while being transported, abandoned ice-fishing shacks, old automobiles or parts thereof, automobiles or similar refuse, or disposable packages containers thrown or deposited as prohibited in this chapter, but not including the wastes of the primary processes of mining, logging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.

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FISCAL NOTE

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The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial The collection of additional fines may increase Department.
