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	Sec.1. 35-A MRSA §3153-A, sub-§2 is enacted to read:
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б	2. Demand charge exemption; small business. For each electric utility, the commission shall establish an electric rate
U	class consisting of all nonresidential customers having 25 or
8	fewer employees. In setting rates for that class, the commission
	shall determine the total energy costs and total demand costs
10	directly attributable to that rate class. That portion of costs
	<u>attributable to energy must be charged to customers in that rate</u>
12	class through a single energy rate. That portion of costs
3.4	attributable to demand may not be charged to any customer in that
14	rate class but must be distributed equitably among customers in all other rate classes.

	For the purposes of this section, the term "energy costs"
18	means the variable costs, including fuel costs, of producing the
	energy delivered to the customer and the term "demand costs"
20	<u>means the fixed costs of the facilities and equipment used to</u>
	<u>produce and deliver electricity to the customers in that rate</u>
