Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the voters of Kennebec County, by referendum, have approved the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$7,900,000 for renovation and expansion of the county jail and law enforcement facilities located in Augusta; and

Whereas, those bonds have been issued and the renovation and expansion is nearing completion; and

Whereas, bonds in the additional amount of \$300,000 must be issued to pay the cost of completion of the renovation and expansion; and

Whereas, the Kennebec County Budget Committee, County commissioners and Kennebec County legislative the delegation have unanimously approved the request for issuance of bonds in the additional amount of \$300,000; and

Whereas, it is necessary that this legislation be enacted as an emergency measure in order to meet the May 1st financing deadline of the Maine Municipal Bond Bank; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

the

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Bonds. 34 To provide funds for completion of the renovation and expansion of the county jail and law enforcement 36 facilities located in Augusta, in addition to authorized to be raised and expended pursuant to Private and 38 Special Law 1987, chapter 113, the treasurer of Kennebec County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may borrow upon the full faith and credit of the county such sums as necessary, 40 not exceeding in the aggregate \$300,000, and may issue bonds Each authorized issue is payable in such annual 42 installments, beginning no earlier than October 1, 1994, as will extinguish each loan on or before December 31, 2013. The bonds 44 must be signed by the county treasurer and countersigned by the 46 majority of the county commissioners. The county may sell the securities at public or private sale upon such terms

2	approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary notes
	of the county, payable in not more than one year from the date of

	STATEMENT OF FACT
22	
	The voters of Kennebec County authorized borrowing
24	\$7,900,000 for renovation and expansion of the county jail and
	law enforcement facilities in Augusta. This bill authorizes the
26	Kennebec County commissioners to issue additional bonds in the
	amount of \$300,000, which is needed to pay costs for which state
28	funds are no longer available. Section 3 of the bill exempts
	this legislation from the requirement of a referendum.
