An Act to Require Legislative Confirmation of the Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 25 MRSA §2955, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1991, c. 837, Pt. B, §13 and c. 841, §11, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

1. Director. The agency is managed by a director who reports to the commissioner. The director must be an experienced 8 law enforcement officer. The Chief of the State Police, the Maine Sheriffs' Association and the Maine Chiefs of Police 10 Association may each nominate one candidate as Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency for submission to the Maine Drug 12 Enforcement Agency Advisory Board. The advisory board shall submit one of the 3 nominations to the commissioner who may 14appoint that person with the approval of the Governor and subject 16 to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters and to confirmation by 18 the Legislature. If the commissioner or the Governor does not approve of the candidate submitted, each of the nominating groups 20 is requested to submit an additional nomination. The director serves at the pleasure of the commissioner. Eligibility for this appointment may not be dependent upon the parent law enforcement 22 agency, if any, of the person selected. If the person selected is currently an employee of any state, county or local law 24 enforcement agency, the person must be placed on temporary 26 assignment by the person's employing agency. The director shall report directly to the commissioner, notwithstanding any existing command structure of the person's employing agency. 28 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the person retains 30 and continues to accrue seniority and retirement rights and benefits within the person's employing agency for the time in which the person serves as director. 32

34 Sec. 2. Application. An individual serving as the Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency on the effective date of this 36 Act is subject to the legislative review and confirmation procedure required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 25, 38 section 2955, subsection 1, as repealed and replaced in this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill makes the position of Director of the Maine Drug 44 Enforcement Agency subject to review by the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary and to confirmation by the Legislature. 46 This bill applies to the person currently holding the position of director.
