12	A. Critical incident. "Critical incident" means a situation in which there is probable cause to believe that a
14	person is holding a hostage while committing a crime or who is barricaded and resisting apprehension through the use or
16	threatened use of force.
18	<u>B. Commanding law enforcement officer. "Commanding law enforcement officer" means a law enforcement officer who has</u>
20	jurisdiction and is in charge at a critical incident.
22	<u>C. Law enforcement officer. "Law enforcement officer"</u> means a person who by virtue of public employment is vested
24	by law with a duty to maintain public order, to prosecute offenders and to make arrests for crimes.
