HOUSE AMENDMENT " " to S.P. 155, L.D. 486, Bill, "An Act Concerning the Mandatory Use of Car Safety Seat Belts"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 3. Statutory referendum procedure; submission at statewide election; form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at a statewide election to be held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Do you favor the enactment of a law that requires the use of seat belts by all occupants in a motor vehicle?"

32 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square 34 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation 36 meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. 38 shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of 40 the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect 30

days after the date of the proclamation.
