

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3725-A, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c.
5 780, Pt. DDD, §10, is amended to read:

6 1. **Distribution to community coordinating committees.**
7 Notwithstanding section 3873, the bureau shall distribute income
8 available under this section to the community coordinating
9 committees created under chapter 1057. The bureau shall
10 distribute the income ~~en--a--per--capita--basis~~ among all the
11 coordinating committees, with each coordinating committee
12 receiving an amount that reflects the population demographics of
13 its area of jurisdiction. The community coordinating committees
14 shall use funds received under this subsection to award direct
15 grants for the development and operation of prevention programs
16 and to fund prevention programs and activities sponsored by the
17 committees.

21 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

22 This bill allows community coordinating committees that
23 receive Maine Children's Trust Fund income to retain funds for
24 the operation of their own prevention programs and revises the
25 basis for statewide distribution of trust fund income.
