An Act to Extend the Probationary Period for Teachers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §13201, as amended by PL 1989, c. 285, is further amended to read:

\$13201. Nomination and election of teachers; teacher contracts

The superintendent shall nominate all teachers, subject to

such regulations governing salaries and the gualifications of teachers as the school board shall-make makes. Upon the approval of nominations, by the school board, the superintendent may 12 employ teachers so nominated and approved for such terms as the superintendent may-deem considers proper, subject to the approval 14 of the school board. Prior to May 15th before the expiration of a first-er-2nd-year first-year, 2nd-year or 3rd-year probationary teacher's contract, the superintendent shall notify the teacher 16 in writing of the superintendent's decision to nominate or not nominate that teacher for another teaching contract. If, after 18 receiving a complaint from a teacher, the commissioner finds that the superintendent has failed to notify a teacher of a decision 20 not to nominate that teacher, the school administrative unit 22 shall pay a forfeiture to the teacher. The amount of that forfeiture shall <u>must</u> be equal to the teacher's per diem salary rate times the number of days between the notification deadline 24 and the date on which notification is made or on which the 26 complaint is filed, whichever occurs first. In--ease If the superintendent of schools and the school board fail to legally 28 elect a teacher, the commissioner shall-have has the authority to appoint a substitute teacher who shall will serve until such that 30 election is made.

32 After a probationary period not to exceed 2 3 years, subsequent contracts of duly certified teachers shall must be for 34 not less than 2 years. Unless a duly certified teacher receives written notice to the contrary at least 6 months before the 36 terminal date of the contract, the contract shall must be extended automatically for one year and similarly in subsequent 38 years. The right to an extension for a longer period of time through a new contract is specifically reserved to the 40 contracting parties.

42 Just cause for dismissal or nonrenewal shall--be is a negotiable item in accordance with the procedure set forth in 44 Title 26, chapter 9-A, for teachers who have served beyond the probationary period.

After a probationary period of 2 3 years, any teacher, who 48 receives notice in accordance with this section that his-or-her the teacher's contract is not going to be renewed, may, during 50 the 15 days following such notification, request a hearing with

the school board. The teacher may request reasons. The hearing shall <u>must</u> be private except by mutual consent and except that either or both parties may be represented by counsel. That hearing must be granted within 30 days of the receipt of the teacher's request.

The right to terminate a contract, after due notice of 90 days, is reserved to the school board when changes in local conditions warrant the elimination of the teaching position for which the contract was made. The order of layoff and recall shall be <u>is</u> a negotiable item in accordance with the procedures set forth in Title 26, chapter 9-A, provided that in any negotiated agreement, the criteria negotiated by the school board and the bargaining agent to establish the order of layoff and recall may <u>includes</u>, but shall <u>is</u> not be limited to, seniority.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill extends the probationary period for public school teachers from 2 years to 3 years.
