An Act to Provide Additional Exemptions to the Need for a Cosmetology License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 32 MRSA § 14203, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 397, §6, is amended to read: 4 Exemptions. The prohibitions and penalties of this 6 1. chapter do not apply to the following persons when acting within the scope of their profession or occupation: 8 Persons authorized by law of this State to practice 10 Α. medicine and surgery and persons under the supervision and 12 control of those persons; Commissioned medical officers of the United States Armed 14Β. Forces; 16 Registered nurses, licensed practical nurses and nurse's C. 18 aides; 20 D. Persons who practice upon members of their immediate families or on persons residing in their household and who 22 receive no payment for such practice; -and 24 Persons employed by licensed establishments who provide Ε. shampooing services within the licensed establishments -; and 26 F. Persons employed to apply special make-up designed for theater lighting to a person who requires this make-up for 28 an appearance in the theater or a movie, on television or as 30 a model. 32 STATEMENT OF FACT 34 Currently, the law allows persons authorized to practice medicine and surgery to perform cosmetology functions without 36 being licensed. This bill extends this exemption to persons working under the supervision of a doctor of medicine or surgery. 38

40 The bill also exempts from the need for a cosmetology license persons who apply the special make-up required for 42 appearance in the theater or as a model.
