

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1742-D, sub-§9 is enacted to read:

6 9. Exception. The land leases of the Department of
8 Conservation are exempted from the provisions of this section.

10 STATEMENT OF FACT

12 Public Law 1991, chapter 9 provided administrative and
14 legislative oversight of the leasing of office space to support
agency programs.

16 The Department of Conservation has some 100 land leases
18 including leases for remote campsites, rafting sites on the West
Branch of the Penobscot River, boat launching sites and
20 snowmobile and ATV trails. These are managed by the bureaus
within the department as authorized by the respective sections of
the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 12, with professional
22 assistance from the Division of Engineering and Realty.

24 This bill specifies that the leases related to land
management and recreation managed by the Department of
26 Conservation are exempted from the provisions related to the
management of other real property by the Department of
28 Administrative and Financial Services.
