2	Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

_	Whereas, quantitative data is needed to assess the impact of
6	unfunded federal mandates on the budget of State Government; and
	Whereas, this data must be presented to the United States Congress at the earliest opportunity in an effort to gain fiscal
10	relief as the State struggles with its budget problems; and
12 14	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately

18	Sec. 1. Data on unfunded federal mandates. Resolved: That all
20	departments and agencies of State Government, including independent agencies and the institutions of higher education
22	that receive an appropriation from the General Fund, shall collect data on the federal mandates that have been imposed on those agencies for which no or partial funding has been
24	provided. Data must be organized in such a way as to identify individual mandated activities, the federal statutes or rules
26	that created each mandate and the estimated cost to fulfill each mandate for state fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95.

30	For the purposes of this resolve, "federal mandate" means any federal legislation or administrative rule adopted by a federal agency that has necessitated a state department or agency

34	Sec. 2. Report to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs. Resolved: That each department or agency
36	subject to the provisions of section 1 of this resolve shall

44	STATEMENT OF FACT
46	State Government has been made responsible for carrying out a variety of activities that have been mandated by the Federal
48	Government but for which federal funds for implementation have

not been made available.

This resolve provides for the collection of quantitative data from each department and agency of State Government on the annual cost of these unfunded federal mandates. This data will be presented to the United States Congress in an effort to assist the State in relaxing these mandates and in balancing its budget for the fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95.
