COMMITTEE AMENDMENT to H.P. 419, L.D. 538

FISCAL NOTE

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The Office of the Governor will incur some minor additional costs to participate in the information and question sessions required by this bill. These costs can be absorbed within the office's existing budgeted resources.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

12 . The original bill establishes a question and answer session between the Legislature and the Governor to be conducted periodically while the Legislature is in session. This amendment 14 changes the frequency of the information session from once every 16 3 weeks to once a month during each regular session or special session lasting at least a month. The amendment adds an effective date section that makes the provisions of the bill 18 effective for the Governor and Legislature assuming office in 1995. The amendment also provides an opportunity to test the 20 effectiveness of the information session by repealing the law on 22 January 1, 1997. Finally, the amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
