SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
425, L.D. 544, Bill, "An Act Regarding Missing Children"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the
following:

'Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the
emergency preamble the following:

'Mandate preamble. This measure requires one or more local
units of government to expand or modify activities so as to
necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues but does
not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures.
Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21,
two thirds of all of the members elected to each House have
determined it necessary to enact this measure.'

Further amend the amendment in the first paragraph after the
title in the first line (page 1, line 16 in amendment) by
striking out the following: "Amend" and inserting in its place
the following: 'Further amend'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of sections
3 and 4 and inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 3. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from
the Federal Expenditure Fund to carry out the purposes of this
Act.

38 for fiscal year 1993-94 of \$17,128 from the Edward Byrne Memorial
40 State and Local Law Enforcement Assistance Program to support a
42 missing children information clearinghouse project. These funds
44 are allocated to the Department of Public Safety for a part-time
46 Clerk Typist II position and general operating expenses to
collect and disseminate information as part of the Missing
Children Information Clearinghouse. The Department of Public
Safety will have an opportunity to apply for additional funding
in fiscal year 1994-95 from the Edward Byrne Memorial State and
Local Law Enforcement Assistance Program.

48 The Department of Public Safety will require General Fund
50 appropriations and Highway Fund allocations totaling \$17,128
annually beginning in fiscal year 1994-95 for a part-time Clerk
Typist II position and general operating expenses to collect and

2 disseminate information as part of the Missing Children
Information Clearinghouse, if federal funding is not available.

4 This bill requires local law enforcement agencies to make
additional expenditures to submit information to the information
6 clearinghouse. Pursuant to the mandate preamble, the 2/3 vote of
all members elected to each House exempts the State from the
8 constitutional requirement to fund 90% of the additional local
cost of these requirements.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT


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The purpose of this amendment is to eliminate the General
