10 STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for motor vehicle registrations to expire on the last day of the owner's birth month. Firms or corporations may designate a month to be used as a "birth month" for registration purposes. It also provides for certificates of inspection to expire on the last day of the month in which the registration expires.
