Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA \$15902, sub-\$1, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693, \$5 and 8, is amended to read:

6 Building committee. The legislative body of a school 1. administrative unit may at-a-regular-or-specially-ealled-meeting establish a special building committee at a regular or specially 8 called meeting held prior to a school construction project 10 receiving the concept approval provided in section 15901. If the legislative body does not establish a special building committee, 12 then the school board shall act as the building committee and may delegate the powers and duties of the building committee to the 14 superintendent. If a vacancy occurs in the membership of a special building committee established under this subsection by 16 the legislative body, the legislative body may fill that vacancy. A special building committee once established has the 18 powers and duties set forth in this chapter.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill clarifies the procedures for the appointment of 24 special building committees by legislative bodies of school administrative units and confirms the powers and duties of 26 special building committees once established.
