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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires school administrative units to offer an elective parenting education course beginning in the fall of 1994. The Department of Education is required to develop a model curriculum for the course that may be adapted by school administrative units to meet local needs. The course will be taught by a qualified teacher already employed in local schools. The department must also adopt rules establishing the criteria for a qualified teacher.

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
