	STATEMENT OF FACT

	This bill permits arraignment by video communication for
16	persons held in custody for Class A, B and C crimes. The purpose
	of this bill is to lessen the need for transportation between the
18	jail and the courthouse, to alleviate safety issues that arise due to transportation, and to expedite the accused's initial
