SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 490, L.D. 648, Bill, "An Act to Require That the Inspection and Investigation Responsibilities of the Electricians' Examining Board Receive Funding Priority"

Amend the amendment by striking out everything after the title and inserting in its place the following:

'Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §1152, first ¶, as amended by PL 1987, c. 395, Pt. B, §6, is further amended to read:

The Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation, with the advice and consent of the board, ~~shall be empowered to~~ may appoint, subject to the Civil Service Law, such employees as may be necessary to carry out this chapter. At no time may there be fewer than 6 electrical inspectors to carry out the mandates of this chapter. The board shall raise funds as necessary to support the costs of its employees and their administrative support. Any person so employed shall must be located in the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and under the administrative and supervisory direction of the Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation.

FISCAL NOTE

The Electricians' Examining Board has already budgeted for a total of 6 Electrical Inspectors in fiscal years 1993-94 and 1994-95. Current dedicated revenue projections for the board indicate that there will be sufficient funds to cover the costs for each of these positions.'
