Resolve, to Establish a Commission to Study the Statutory Procedures for Local Property Tax Abatement Appeals.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, there is an urgent need to reform the current statutory procedures for local property tax abatement appeals; and

Whereas, the number and complexity of local property tax abatement appeals are likely to increase due to recent economic conditions; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Statutory Procedures for Local Property Tax Abatement Appeals is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 9 members appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, at least 3 of whom must be Legislators and the balance of whom must be knowledgeable persons representing a broad spectrum of related interests, including, but not limited to, relevant state, county and municipal agencies and officials, the judiciary and the bar, and large and small property taxpayers; and be it further

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Appointments; meetings. Resolved: all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by the authorities once the selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 30 days after the appointment of all members has been completed. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study and make recommendations to the Legislature concerning revision of the current statutory procedures for local property tax abatement appeals. The objective of this study is to develop a process for hearing and deciding appeals that is clear, comprehensive and

efficient and that results in consistent, equitable and timely decisions. The commission shall consider and may propose reforms 2 to, among other things, appeals procedures and the hierarchy of 4 appellate forums. In conducting the study, the commission may: 8 Hold public hearings; 1.0 Meet at such times and places as the commission determines informational necessary and holdsessions 12 discussions with knowledgeable persons; Establish subcommittees or advisory committees; 14 summarize and analyze 16 Conduct, the results of a literature search; 18 Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups; 20 22 Procure and analyze relevant data; 24 Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal questions within the scope of the study; and 26 Determine and summarize the legislative actions or 28 governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further 30 Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Bureau of Taxation staff the commission. Additional staff 32 including assistance in preparing any recommended legislation, may be requested from the Legislative Council; and be it further 34 Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: 36 That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative 38 per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at commission hearings. All 40 other members are entitled to expenses, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 379, upon application to the 42 Executive Director of the Legislative Council; and be it further Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: 44 That the commission shall submit its report, as approved by 2/3 of its members, together with any

necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 116th Legislature, the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation and the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local

Government no later than November 1, 1993; and be it further
