	The average cost per sentence for a Class E crime is \$4,188 based
б	upon an average length of stay of 67 days. The additional costs
	to the counties for the housing of each offender sentenced under
8	this new crime will not require reimbursement by the State.
10	The additional workload and administrative costs associated
	with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system
12	can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
	Department. The collection of additional fines may increase
14	General Fund revenues by a minor amount.
16	The additional enforcement costs can be absorbed by the
	Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife utilizing existing

22	
	This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. This
24	amendment prohibits the charging of fees for access to land that are contingent upon or directly related to the taking of game on
26	that land. This amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
